Town Hall Meeting Results

On last Sunday's crisp winter afternoon, nearly fifty parishioners gathered in Read Hall to continue the conversation about how to be the face of Christ. We began by reviewing the compiled results of the November Town Hall meeting and then looked at different ways to be Church. Since Church is a Mystery beyond our ability to understand completely, we seek ways to consider its complexity and scope. In his book, *Models of the Church*, Avery Cardinal Dulles, SJ has described six different aspects/roles of church: to preach the Good News, to serve the poor, to share faith experiences, to be the visible sign of God working in the world, to organize and provide structure to support this work, and to live as a witness to a value system based in love and compassion. Dulles calls each of these six a model of Church and reviews how each model has value and is also incomplete. Most of us focus our faith lives through the lens of one aspect of church and can be oblivious or insensitive to the importance of others. After the general presentation about the models and their strengths and weaknesses, the group discussed how to use this information to work together more effectively.

With this context, we returned to the results of the Town Hall meeting and asked ourselves what should be the next steps. In very animated conversation, we decided to form three *ad hoc* committees that would meet over the next month and make recommendations to strengthen our parish. Those committees are Education (with a particular focus on Adult Faith Formation), Welcoming/Hospitality (to help our parish become a more welcoming community), and Administrative Concerns (with a focus on helping improve how the office supports the many ministries of St. Hubert's). Each of these committees will make suggestions to become part of the next parish wide gathering. The group requested that Town Hall meetings be held regularly, scheduled and advertised well in advance so that people can put the dates on their calendars and plan to attend. We ended with a beautiful closing prayer.

For those who were not able to attend, the results of the Town Hall are available for your review in the office. Also, if you are interested in participating in one of the *ad hoc* committees, please let me know.
