A note from the Pastor

When I went to bed last Wednesday after a long day in the office, the last thing I expected was to be awakened a few hours later with the news that two men had vandalized nearly every room of our parish center. They were caught in the act by Langley police officers who quickly responded to the scene when a neighbor called 911 after hearing the sound of breaking glass. I understand one of the men had just been released from jail that morning. I don't imagine he will be experiencing much freedom for awhile. Nor can I imagine what prompted these two to act as they did that night, breaking objects and windows on a mad rampage, turning off the furnace in the church, and ransacking the sacristy. Rather than be angered by what these angry men did, I was saddened. One parishioner voiced anger and I supposed others may be as well, but I suggest that instead of letting anger get the better half of us as a consequence of their destructive conduct, we pray for them and for others who have violated the tranquility of our community in recent weeks. For whatever reason, they are not experiencing God's love even though God loves them no less for what they have done. Maybe that is why they have become addicts. Hopefully our prayers can awaken them to all that God has done for them, prompting them to take the steps to rehabilitate their lives so that someday they can become respected members of society.

That same neighbor talked about how in years past, he could leave his front door unlocked but it seems like that is no longer the case. Our maintenance man, Bob, locks all the doors each afternoon. When there is an evening meeting, the front doors are left unlocked. If you are hosting an evening meeting, we expect that you would be the last person to leave, so when you do, please be certain that the front doors (as well as any doors that your group unlocked) are locked. This is your parish center, so you too have a vested interest in taking care of it. Join me in doing what we can to protect our campus with common sense and prayer. Thank you.
