To date, 33% of our parishioners have participated in this year's Annual Catholic Appeal. The total pledged thus far is \$34,912, roughly 85% of our goal. Again, on behalf of the Archbishop and the many ministries that rely on the Appeal for their support, I thank you for being so generous. Only two parishes have already achieved their goals. We are much closer to the finish line than most parishes in the archdiocese. We will easily cross the finish line when every one else in the parish completes a pledge envelope.

Perhaps you noticed the scroll in the narthex, which lists every person who has filled out a pledge envelope. I am endeavoring to list every household in the parish, so complete your envelope soon and your name will be added to the scroll! If for whatever reason, you cannot offer a monetary pledge, then offer the gift of a prayer for the success of the appeal when you fill out your envelope. (If you prefer not to have your name listed on the scroll, let the office know and we will remove your name.) Hopefully, we will again exceed our goal, and if we do, our rebates will go into savings to fund needs in the coming year that we otherwise could not afford. Every gift of any amount is valued.

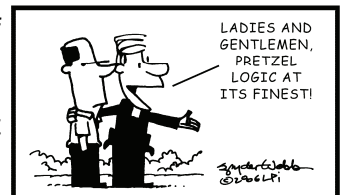
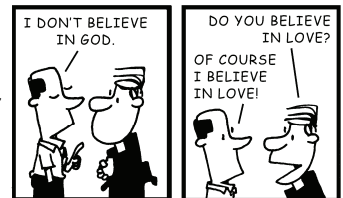
