### *A message from our pastor*

I recall Bob Dylan's song, *For The Times, They are a' changing...* Well, as you may have heard by now, The Vatican has given its approval to the latest translation of the Roman Missal, so allow me to say, *"For our lines, they are a changing..."* I learned from the Office of Liturgy at the chancery that the new missal will be implemented sometime in 2011, either at the start of Lent or Advent. This will give publishers time to edit and bound sufficient copies for every parish in our country.

In the meantime, opportunities will be provided for us to learn about the new missal. There will be regional workshops around the country (I will be attending a two day session in Burien in late September.) If you are computer savvy, you can access the new translation by going to [www.usccb.org](http://www.usccb.org), the website of the United States Conference of Bishops. There you can find access to the new Roman Missal and download it.

As I expected, I noticed a number of changes. Many of the prayers have been changed, such as the Confiteor, the Gloria, and the Creed. Some lines you are used to saying, such as "And also with you," have been altered as well. Your new response will be "And with your Spirit." No longer will you be proclaiming, "Christ has died..." after the consecration, but I noticed a few prayers were left unchanged, namely the Sanctus and the Lord's Prayer.

Be assured that once I have taken the workshop, the liturgy committee and I will provide opportunities to prepare you to understand these changes and to fully participate in the new liturgy. Unlike what happened after Vatican II, the Mass itself has not changed. All that has been altered is the translation. Our bishops believe that this new translation is truer to the original Latin.
