A message from our pastor

One thing you will never hear me say publicly in the coming months is an endorsement of any candidate for office. According to canon law, that would be inappropriate for me to do. I may, as I have in the past, talk about issues that warrant comments when they are ethical, such as the initiative being promoted by Gov. Booth Gardner to legitimize euthanasia. Next Friday, we celebrate our nation's independence. That prompts me to urge every voter in the parish to make an effort to study the candidates, the parties, and the issues in light of our Catholic faith and the teachings of our Church. Simply put, neither party commands my respect when it comes to the sanctity of life so we as Christians are faced with tough choices this fall. While one party appears to be pro-life and the other isn't, neither based on their actions of the past eight years is hardly the standard bearer for a consistent ethic of life.

On July 11, Sr. Sharon Park, the director of the Washington state Catholic Conference, will give a presentation on "Forming Consciences for faithful citizenship" at St. Charles in Burlington from 10 AM until 3 PM. If this is of interest to you, please let me know by noon on July 2, as we have to register in advance since lunch is being served. As citizens of the most powerful nation, we have a moral obligation to carefully consider the demands of the gospel when we make choices about the future of our nation and our world. I imagine Sr. Sharon, whom I have known for years, will offer much help and insights for us in this regards.

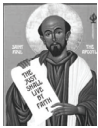
