A message from our pastor

I recently asked a parishioner to consider serving on the Stewardship Council, which I am presently forming. "No thanks, Father, but I am not into talking about money." Is that what comes to mind when you hear me talk about stewardship? Granted, tithing is a crucial element of living a life of stewardship, but there is much more to it than what one donates to the parish. Stewardship is more a way of life than a single particular action. As our understanding of stewardship deepens, it becomes a motivating value in our lives that is freely chosen and acted upon, not with the expectation of reward from God, but done because it is the means by which we place God first in our lives. Bishop Robert Morneau of Green Bay, WI, observes, "By acknowledging our dependence upon God for all of life, we are called to regard both material things and human capacities not as private possessions or as the property of limited groups, but as God's."

Notice that I haven't really defined all that stewardship is it is a big subject. Coming to better understand all that stewardship is will be the goal of the council in its first year. The ultimate goal of this council will be to assist me in awakening everyone in the parish to seeing the potential in themselves for becoming good stewards. But first I need to gather good stewards to advise me. Are you interested in serving on this council? Do you see yourself as a good steward? If so, give me a call. If I see you as a good steward, don't be surprised if I give you a call sometime this month.

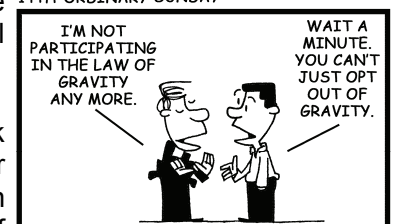
